Another month when passenger numbers increased by more than 10% (+13.87%). Movements increased for the 3rd month in a row and the Moving Annual total is now up to +6.71%. In is even possible that 2011 will be a record breaking year (ever the optimist!)

If it wasn't for the new routes the figures wouldn't be so good, because 13 routes show a decrease and only 9 increased when compared to a year ago. The biggest losers were Innsbruck (-70%), Las Palmas (-60%), Islamabad (-29%) and Dublin (-21%). The gainers were Sharm-el-Shiekh (+508%), Enontekio [Lapland](+503%), Faro (+202%) and Geneva (+81%). Three routes didn't operate this year and there were seven new routes.

All the domestic routes showed a year on year decline. The worst being Edinburgh (-60%), Aberdeen (-59%), Glasgow (-50%).

December was when the ice and snow came, so unsurprisingly there were NINE diversions away, going to Blackpool (1), Doncaster (2), East Midlands (1), Liverpool (2) and Manchester (3). For once we received more diversions than lost in that ELEVEN flights diverted into Leeds/Bradford including Birmingham, Heathrow, Aberdeen and Stansted.
