A very impressive set of figures this month. A year on year increase of 32.61% is amazing, HOWEVER, don't forget the big freeze that happened in January 2010. Even domestic passenger numbers increased by 7.25% also, there was an increase of movements of 27.62%. I think there is a distinct possibility that 2011 will be a record breaking year!

As you can imagine there have been some big increases on international routes, with the best being Fuerteventura (+984%), Barcelona (+640%), Sharm-el-Sheikh (+523%), Faro (+285%) and Geneva(+101%). Surprisingly there were 10 routes with less passengers: Innsbruck (-37%) , Bridgetown (-35%) and Islamabad (-26%). Three routes didn't operate this year Lyon, Turin and Gerona and there were 8 new routes, mainly Ryanair...

On the domestic routes SIX routes increased and SIX decreased. The best performing were Southampton (+20%), Gatwick (+17%), Belfast Int (+14%) and Glasgow (+9%)

During the month 4 flights were diverted to Manchester and we received one flight that was destined for Liverpool.
