Another excellent month, again with a 16+% increase in passenger numbers and the movements also increased by a creditable by 5.89%. The interesting statistic is that the Charter traffic increase (+17.32%), as a percentage, was higher than Scheduled traffic increase (+16.84%). Unsurprisingly Domestic traffic dropped again. I can see a day when the only domestic routes will be Jersey (Summer), Belfast and the Isle of Man.

There were 34 International Routes, with 11 showing an increase and 9 of these showed an increase in excess of 29%. The best being Rome (+957%), Faro (+328%), Fuerteventura (+140%), and Tenerife (+92%). There were 11 routes with a decrease the worst being Islamabad (-46%), Murcia (-30%), Bridgetown(-23%) and Dalaman(-23%). There were six routes that didn't operate compared to November 2009 and 11 new routes, primarily operated by Ryanair.

Domestically all routes, except Belfast showed a double digit decrease, Interestingly Belfast City showed a 9% decrease and Belfast International a 10% increase. What more can I say about domestic air travel.

It was a bad month for diverts with 13 flights diverting away, primarily to Manchester, but we did receive one flight that was meant to land at Doncaster.
